Dear Lodge President,

Several months ago I had the opportunity to view a new service that will revolutionize the way missing and abducted children are located. The name of this service is National PhotoAlert, or NPA. NPA works by storing images of children, the elderly, or any person of interest (i.e. sexual predators, suspected terrorists, etc.) for the purpose of dissemination should the need arise. The dissemination process is simple.

When a child is reported missing, an alert can be issued within a specific geographic area anywhere from one to ninety miles. A picture of the missing child is broadcast to every recipient's cell phone or email, and a text message is immediately sent with the pertinent information. Within a matter of minutes, a PhotoAlert can be generated and the recovery process can begin. We are all aware of the statistic published by the FBI stating that if a child is not recovered within the first three hours of being reported missing, the likelihood of finding that child drops to less than 15%.

Our Grand Lodge Executive Board was so impressed by the service that at our Grand Lodge National Conference in August, 2007, our National Board unanimously voted in favor of partnering with the US Communications Corporation (US ComCorp) on this very important project.

The NPA service, scheduled to be released to the general public in February of 2008, will officially be known as **The Fraternal Order of Police National PhotoAlert Network**. Along with naming rights, US ComCorp has agreed to engage in a revenue sharing program with the FOP. Members will also have the opportunity to produce individual revenue as consultants for their region.

US ComCorp is a privately held corporation headquartered in Columbus, Ohio, and is an industry leader in designing and implementing innovative communication systems.

In order to make this project a success, **I am asking that as Lodge President you be the proactive voice in asking your local members to register as alert recipients and clients of NPA before January 1, 2008.** By combining the far-reaching resources of the FOP, we can truly make a difference by participating in the building of a comprehensive network of alert recipients.
